APRIL'S MINUTES

The April meeting of the Mid Cities Commodore Club was called to order by Garry Wordelman.

The first order of business was the election of club officers. The motion was made that all running for office be voted in with a single show of hands. The motion was seconded and passed.

Treasurer Bruce Nelson reported a membership of 110 members and \$1064.00

in the treasury.

Newsletter editor Steve Stockdale gave an overview of the newsletter purpose and intent. He also asked for volunteers to help in the mailing of the newsletter. He requested that all items for the newsletter be submitted two weeks prior to the next meeting.

Librarian David Sunkel announced the present procedures for receiving library software. Disk copies require a \$1.00 (mailer) fee and \$.50 postage fee. The mailer fee is refundable. Cassette copies only require a \$.50 postage fee.

David emphasized that the only way for the sizable library material to get distributed will be for members to trade among themselves.

Approximately 150 VIC-20 programs were donated to the club at the April meeting.

Bryan Foley was named as a new C-64 group leader.

George Crowley (Modem leader) explained what a modem is and some of its uses and services available to the modem user. He then gave a demonstration using the local Star-Text service.

President Garry Wordelman gave names of local stores that will give club members discounts and then lead discussion of the magazines available to the Commodore user.

Garry asked for a volunteer to act as Education group leader. At that time no one volunteered. The meeting was adjorned to group discussion and Software trading.

David Sunkel reports that there should be copies of the public domain library available at the May meeting. Also, some of the VIC-20 programs will be available for copying.


George Crowley reports that to use your modem to talk directly with another computer, you need to use the half-duplex mode.


