PRESIDENT'S NOTES

I'd like to welcome all of you new members. As of June 4, we have 124 C64 members, 56 VIC, and 3 PET for a total membership of 183.

It is evident that we are experiencing some growing pains. Although we had hoped that we would have a permanent "home" at the Hurst Rec Center, we may have to look elsewhere if we continue this rapid growth.

One step which we must take is to more formally structure our meetings in order to avoid the seeming chaos at last month's meeting. To this end, please note the following rules and agenda for the June 18th meeting:

1. All machines should be left OFF until the software demonstration/exchange period.
2. The first hour will consist of the business meeting, program, and questions pertaining to these two topics only.
3. The next thirty minutes will consist of the 64 and VIC individual group meetings with the Group Leaders presiding. At this time, they will answer written questions which you will have been given an opportunity to write, as well as announcing what programs are available for copying.
4. After this Q & A period, the informal discussion and exchange will take place. PLEASE try to keep the noise level down! Your courtesy will be appreciated (and, we hope, reciprocated) by all.

At the June 4 executive meeting, the following expenditures were approved: \$30 to purchase the VIC-20 public domain volumes; \$45 to purchase miscellaneous supplies pertaining to the newsletter; and the funds necessary to publish new directories and publish and mail the newsletter.

Many thanks to the following volunteers: Ken Westbrook-VIC 20 group leader; Diane Dews-C64 group leader; and Joe Kent-Education Chairman.

Please note that this month's program deals with "Screen Format and File Processing for Business Applications" by Henry Zaehring. Henry is Bell Helicopter's Educational Coordinator. It should be a great meeting -- hope to see you there. Garry W.

MAY MINUTES

The May 21, 1983 meeting was called to order by Garry Wordelman. Minutes of the April meeting were read by Secretary Ken Widner. Treasurer Bruce Nelson reported the club's finances and membership status - 97 C64, 48 VIC, and 3 PET. David Sunkel announced that up to 3 library disks may be mailed in one mailer. Steve Stockdale asked for comments on the newsletter - the response was favorable - and encouraged people to contribute.

Ken Westbrook was named as the new VIC-20 group leader. Twenty-two members expressed an interest in Ham Radio.

Garry announced that Taylor Computers was selling out all VIC software at 50% off. He also reported that expenses to incorporate may be prohibitive.

Todd Stine and Dennis Foreman of Metroplex Computers presented the program, discussing repair of Commodore hardware.

Some monitor problems were discussed among the members, the most significant being that with the new Commodore monitor, the rear plug-in provides greater resolution than the front plug-in.

Joe Kent volunteered to become the Education Chairman and set up a course in BASIC.

The meeting adjourned to informal chaos and software exchange.

AMENDMENTS

The following amendments to the constitution will be presented to the membership at the June 18th meeting and will be voted upon at the July 16th meeting. Please read and ponder prior to the next meeting.

1. ARTICLE II, Section 1.

ELIGIBILITY. Membership status shall be extended to any dues-paying person or family without regard to race, color, or creed.

2. ARTICLE VII, Section 3.

Expenditures required to conduct regular club correspondence such as the newsletter, membership directories, software catalogs, etc. shall be exempt from the approval requirements. Exempted expenses shall include costs associated with reproduction and distribution to the membership.

3. ARTICLE VII, Section 4.

Any items which are purchased by the club to further club activities and goals will become club assets and remain the sole property of the club until the club is dissolved.

4. ARTICLE VIII, Section 3.

DISSOLUTION. An amendment to dissolve the club shall be the process by which the club shall cease operations and void all memberships.

Upon dissolution, all club assets shall be sold within a reasonable time. The proceeds of the sale, along with any cash remaining in the club treasury, shall be equally distributed to all regular members at the time of the dissolution vote.

ESCAPE CHARACTER WEDGE

Have you ever had need for an "escape" key and only then noticed that your C64 doesn't have one? Some word processors, like Word Pro 3, or text services like Star Text, require the use of escape characters. The accompanying program makes this facility available to you. This is accomplished by re-defining 'F1' (chr\$(133)) to escape (chr\$(27)). Lines 40-70 place the wedge at \$C020. The machine language routine was placed there because \$C000-\$CFFF is protected from BASIC. This insures that the wedge will not interfere with your Basic programs. Line 130 places a very small routine at \$2000. This routine simply changes the hardware vector (\$0314-\$0315) from its usual value (\$EA31) to point at the wedge (\$C020). The wedge in turn jumps to the usual hardware interrupt vector. Those of you with Supermon 64 (or similar utility) may disassemble the wedge to see how it works. Once the program is run, typing 'F1' will output an escape character. The re-definition will remain in effect until a Control Z or the Run/Stop-Restore sequence is entered.

COPYING THE C64 DOS WEDGE

(From the June issue of COMPUTE! magazine)

You may copy this handy program to any of your diskettes with the aid of a machine language monitor now available from the Club Library: SUPERMON-64. Here is the procedure:

1. LOAD and RUN the SUPERMON-64 program.
2. Within the monitor, load the DOS 5.1 program into memory by entering L"DOS 5.1",08.
3. You may now save the wedge into any diskette by entering S"DOS 5.1",08,CC00,CF5A.
4. Exit the monitor by entering X.

To load the wedge, enter LOAD"DOS 5.1",8,1.

To enable the wedge, enter SYS52224.

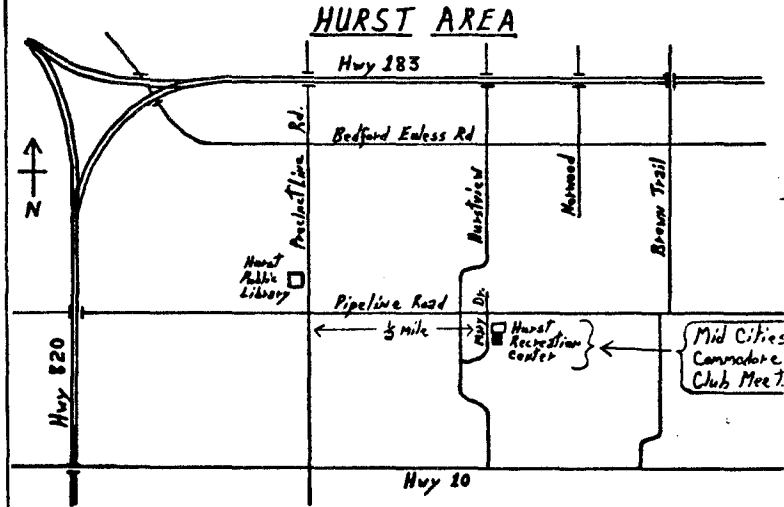
