## BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The January meeting of the MCCC Board of Directors was held Saturday, January 7, at the home of President Diane Dews. Attending were Diane, Ken Widner, Steve Stockdale, Bruce Nelson, Barbara Cramer, Leonard Parker, Jesse Cardin and Gary Wordelman.

Bruce announced that we have had 171 membership renewals so far and 33 new memberships. He recently purchased 500 disks which will be for sale at the next meeting, Jan. 21, at cost. The treasury has a balance of \$2593.83.

The board discussed buying an MSD Dual Disk Drive for the librarian. Leonard has had trouble copying some of the library's disks with the club's 1541. Because of the demands for library programs and the anticipated growth of the club, the board decided to buy the MSD Disk Drive and trade the 1541 for a new one (for \$85.00). The new 1541 will be used by Jesse Cardin for the VIC 20 library.

The board also approved the petitions to form the HEB, Ft. Worth and Arlington chapters.

The remainder of the meeting was spent discussing plans for the Open House at the Jan. 21st meeting, and the organization of the new chapters. The next board meeting will be held Feb. 4th at a place and time to be decided.

### DISK DIRECTORY PRINT

For those of you with a need to be neat and organized, here is the procedure for printing the directory for each of your disks. You may then use the printout as a label or simply store it with the disks. It will give your library that "well-groomed look" and make it much easier to find any program.

This procedure will work on the Gemini 10, Gemini 10X, Commodore 1525. We suspect that it will probably work on other printers (suitably interfaced) as well.

1. Insert disk for desired directory.
2. Type - LOAD "\$",8 (RETURN)
3. Type - OPEN 4,4,2 (RETURN)
4. Type - CMD 4 (RETURN)
5. Type - LIST (RETURN)
6. Type - PRINT # 4, CLOSE 4 (RETURN)

## PROGRAMMER'S HINTS

At some time or another, every programmer comes across a piece of information that everyone takes for granted as 'common knowledge'. For the new programmer it is often frustrating to discover these priceless pokes as they are usually buried in a lengthy volume of technical material. This can be very frustrating for the novice who is just beginning to understand the language. Here are some useful shortcuts from Danny Oxford.

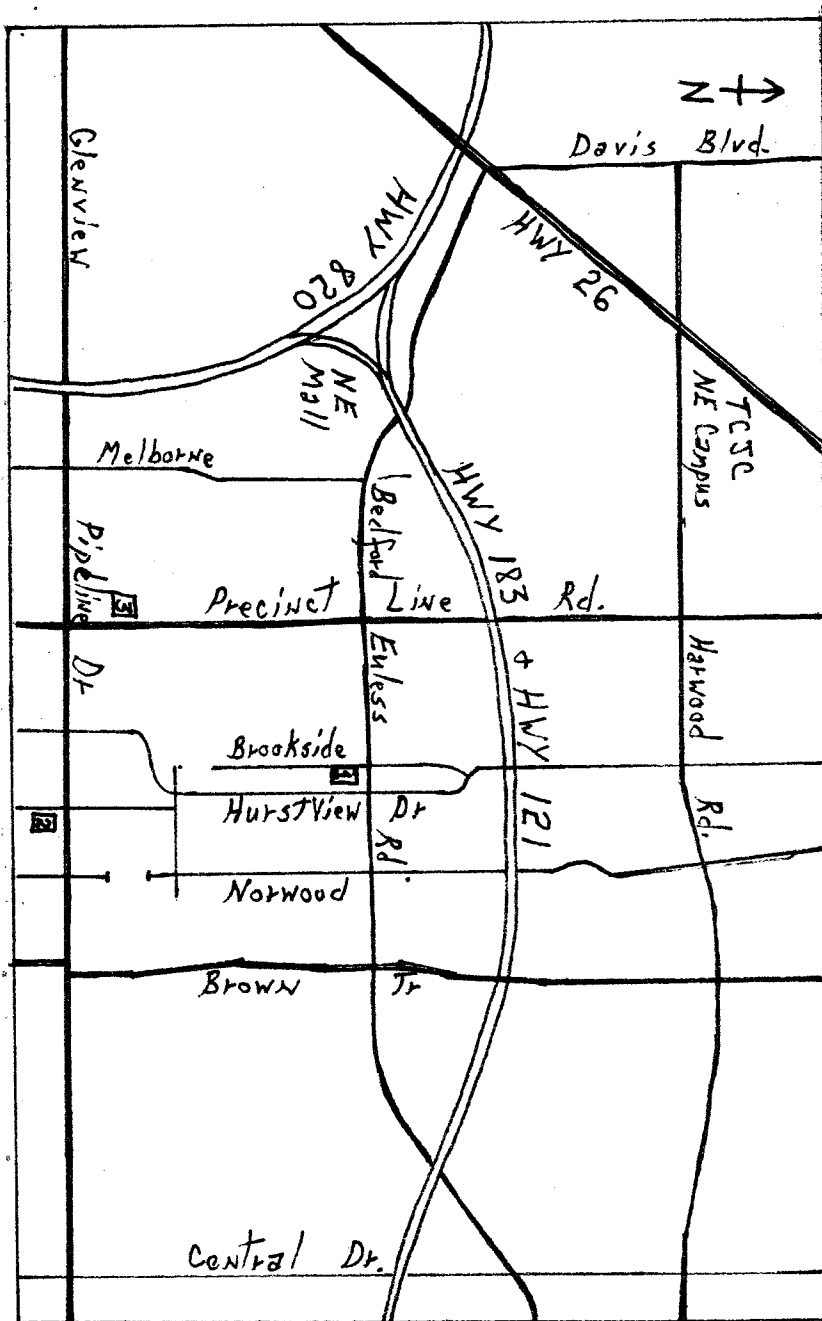
1. For repeat keying (pressing a key to repeat that character without lifting) use POKE 650,128.
2. To disable the Run/Stop key use POKE788,53.
3. To re-enable the Run/Stop key use POKE788,49.
4. To move the cursor to line "X" use POKE 214,X. ("X" may be any number.)

3. HURST PUBLIC LIBRARY

This handy utility program will merge two program files provided the line numbers are different in both programs. For example, if Program "A" is numbered from 0-300, Program "B" should be numbered anywhere from 301 to the limit. Our thanks to Danny Oxford for sharing this program.

Step 1. Load Program File "A".

Step 2. Press shifted (CLR-HOME) key.

Step 3. Type - PRINT PEEK(43),PEEK(44). This should cause the computer to print a "1" and an "8". If it does not produce these numbers make a note of the numbers that result.

Step 4. Press shifted (CLR-HOME) key.

Step 5. Type - A=PEEK(45)+256\*PEEK(46)-2 :  
B=INT(A/256) : POKE 43,A-256\*B : POKE44,B

Step 6. Load Program File "B".

Step 7. Type - POKE 43,1:POKE44,8. If the numbers on step three were different than the desired 1 and 8, substitute the numbers noted.

Step 8. Type - LIST - to check that the two programs were merged properly.

Step 9. Type - SAVE "NEW PROGRAM NAME",8.
