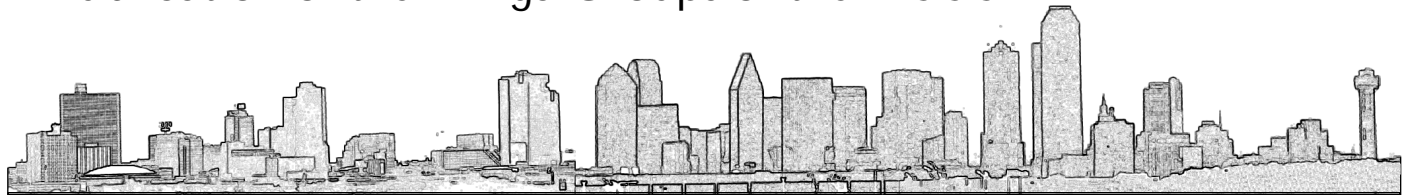

Of course, the big news is the news out of Amiga... that QNX is out and the Linux kernel is in. The shock waves still haven't settled down from that yet, with many people feeling that Linux doesn't have as much to offer as ■■■►

QNX did. I'm not enough of a techie to know if that's true or not. I do know that keeping the Linux kernel current with the latest hardware drivers, etc. is likely to be an easier proposition, since there seems to already be a lot of interest in Linux in the computing world. To average users like you and I, what kernel is being used is of little importance. We'll never see it, just as we never see the Amiga kernel (the 3.1 ROM) that's there now. What we'll be looking for is a top-notch, ground-breaking new interface that Amiga has been and is still promising, and blistering fast performance. Whether Amiga can deliver on the promise remains to be seen, but I don't see that the announcement of a different kernel has any bearing on the outcome at all. Speaking for myself, I'm still on the bandwagon and still waiting to plunk my money down on a new Amiga NG.

Anyway that's my two cents worth. For a collection of press releases, claims and counter-claims, and opinions

on the subject, check out the web site. If you're not up on the latest developments yet, you should be.
